Dear Mr. Epperly:

Your December 20, 1989, letter to the Governor's Office was forwarded to the Archives Division of the State Library on January 23, 1990. Enclosed are the copies of Senate and House Journal reports that you requested, along with the text of the Governor's address to the joint houses and a copy of President Andrew Johnson's telegram to Governor Throckmorton. I checked the extant bill files for the Eleventh Legislature, to see if the bill or the committee reports were still in our holdings. Neither document, however, was among the legislative records now in the State Archives.

We have a 27-page, 11 x 17 page size letter from John H. Reagan, former Postmaster General of the Confederacy (who had been captured with Jefferson Davis, and who shared his imprisonment at Fort Warren) concerning the position of the Negro in the post-war society. We can copy this full size @25¢/page (\$6.75) or we can reduce the text size to fit on a regular copy page (15¢/page=\$4.05). Postage and handling for this copy would be an extra \$1.25.

I hope that this information will be of assistance to you in your study. Please remit \$2.20 (\$1.65 copy charges + \$.75 postage & handling).

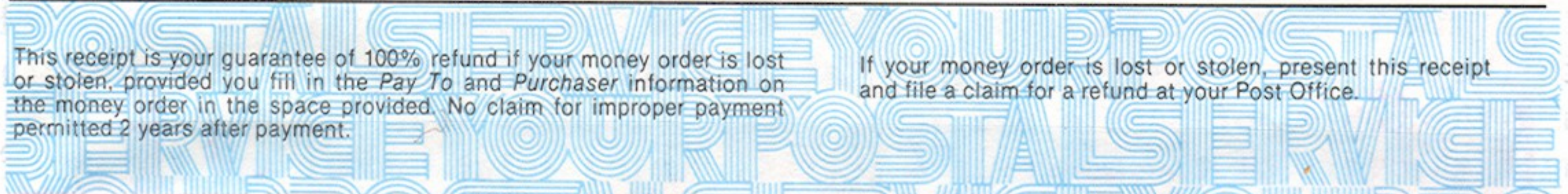
