No. 74, House engrossed bill to incorporate the Marion cotton and woollen manufactory, at Marion, Smyth county, Virginia, was read a third time and passed.

A motion by Mr. Morgan, to reconsider the vote just taken, was rejected.

No. 75, House engrossed bill to incorporate the Rockbridge mining company, was read a third time, and passed.

A motion by Mr. Graham to reconsider the vote just taken, was rejected.

The following house engrossed bills were read a third time, and passed: .

No. 76, A bill to incorporate the Charlottesville and University railroad company.

No. 77, A bill to amend the first section of an act to incorporate the Middleburg and Plain's station turnpike company.

On motion of Mr. Merritt, two-thirds of the members elect to the house concurring,

No. 88, House joint resolution in relation to the constitutional amendment, was read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Merritt, the pending question was ordered, and the joint resolution was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Having been presently engrossed,

On motion of Mr. Bently, two-thirds of the members elect to the house concurring, the joint resolution was read a third time, and passed—yeas 74; nay 1.
