

# Colorado Gold - The 14th Amendment

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I've done a lot of research on this one, and it is complicated, so stay with me on it. First of all, the 14<sup>th</sup> is the longest of all the Amendments, and as far as I am concerned, possibly the most destructive, as far as it has helped to destroy America. Two Sections especially are a disaster. Section One says that anyone born here, is automatically a US citizen, and in Section Four, it says that the validity of the public debt of the United States, authorized by law .... shall not be questioned. Virtually none of the public debt has been authorized by law! When pregnant Mexican illegals come here to have their babies, which become automatic citizens, Section One has proven to be a disaster. Section One, basically eliminates the Tenth Amendment, by stating that no state shall make any law, basically, which contradicts federal laws. This gives the D.C. Gang the technical right and ability to make all states subservient to D.C. Section Three is so convoluted, that no one seems to know what it means. Section Five sums it all up by saying that D.C. has authority over all states and all legislation which may be passed by the states. Bad Amendment, and it was never ratified legally.

Suppose you were one of the Southern States which had seceded, you were brought back into the Union, and after being officially bought back on April 2, 1866, your representatives were denied the right to vote? Not totally, but denied the right to vote at certain times, when such a vote would not agree with what the victorious North wanted? That's exactly what happened when the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment came to a vote. There were 36 states in the Union when the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment was (not) passed. This means that 27 states had to ratify the Amendment. Texas rejected it on October 27, 1866. Georgia rejected it on November 9, 1866. Florida rejected it on December 6, 1866. Alabama rejected it on December 7, 1866. North Carolina rejected it on December 14, 1866. Arkansas rejected it on December 17, 1866. Kentucky rejected it on January 8, 1867. Virginia rejected it on January 9, 1867. Louisiana rejected it on February 6, 1867. Delaware rejected it on February 7, 1867. Maryland rejected it on March 23, 1867. Mississippi rejected it on January 31, 1867. Ohio rejected it on January 16, 1867. New Jersey rejected it on March 24, 1867.

Their respective Senators and Representatives were prohibited from voting their state's rejection, so it '*passed*,' was vetoed by President Andrew Johnson, and his veto was over-ridden. It does no good to say that the states were never actually re-admitted into the Union, because not only were they re-admitted, but their votes were counted when

the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment (*anti slavery*) was passed earlier. Yes, the South did vote to eliminate slavery. They were not counted for the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment. Fifteen of the 36 states then in the Union, rejected the Amendment, but the 15 states were denied their votes, so it was fraudulently added to the Constitution, and the Supreme Court, later upheld the fraud, as they did the also unconstitutionally non-ratified 16<sup>th</sup> Amendment, which gave us the IRS.

Not only was the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment not ratified Constitutionally, but also the three "*Reconstruction Acts*" were also '*passed*' the same way. Those acts required federal troops to occupy the Southern States, and rule over them, even though each state had its own legislature, duly voted upon, and in session. This allowed the carpetbaggers and scalawags to invade the South, and execute hideous outrages to its citizens, similar to the utter destruction the Yankees did to the South before the War was over. The total destruction, rape, arson, and pillage that occurred at the hands of Yankee soldiers was unbelievable, and accounts of it will make one sick at one's stomach. The book, "*The Real Lincoln*," which I highly recommend, details that virtual extermination of the South.

The 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment, basically has thrown us at the mercy of Washington D.C. and its Senators and Congressmen, who think it is their lawful right to rule America, take it to war, and destroy its currency and stability.

The 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment, is a radical departure from the Founder's intent, when they wrote and voted for the Constitution. The original concept of a federal government, was that the individual states were supreme (*10<sup>th</sup> Amendment*), and the individual states ran themselves, as their legislatures and voters chose. Arizona and 21 other states, currently are bucking the Democrat health outrage, citing the 10<sup>th</sup> Amendment. Tom Jefferson, when he wrote the Declaration of Independence, protested to Mother England in the name of a United States ... of America, not a huge,
