In Regard: Case of **DEBORAH MORSE, ET AL., vs. JOSEPH FREDERICK**

Honorable Justices of the U.S. Supreme Court

The purpose of this letter is to inform the Justices of the U.S. Supreme Court of a pending action that is before the U.S. Archivist that may have a direct effect upon the jurisdiction of this U.S. Supreme Court and its inferior Federal Courts in the case of Deborah Morse, et.al., Petitioners vs. Joseph Frederick, Respondent (U.S. Supreme Court Case Number 06-278). The question of jurisdiction of this case (*and other cases pending before this U.S. Supreme Court*) relies upon the lawful existence of the U.S. Constitution, 14th Amendment.

The U.S. Court of Appeals, 9th Circuit ruled that Joseph Frederick's "*Rights*" were violated when School Principle, Deborah Morse, removed his banner that was being displaying during an Olympic Touch Parade in Juneau Alaska. Deborah Morse made an interpretation that the language of the banner (*Bong Hits 4 Jesus*) was promoting the use of illicit drugs in violation of School Policy. As stated by the Attorney for the Plaintiff, this case was brought before the U.S. District Court under 42 USC 1983 with the lower

Federal Courts applying the 1st Article of the Bill of Rights via the U.S. Constitution, 14th Amendment as jurisdictional authority for their ruling of the case.

It is irrelevant what the merits of this case may be if the U.S. Archivist issues forth a determination that the U.S. Constitution, 14th Amendment was “*rejected*” by more than one-fourth of the States. As noted by this U.S. Supreme Court in cases of past years, the determinations of the U.S. Secretary of State (*Archivist of the United States*) on the ratification or rejection of Amendments to the U.S. Constitution by the Legislatures of the States of the Union is binding upon the Courts of the United States. The U.S. Congress has proclaimed in past years that Title 42 USC Sections 1981 through 1983 would be unconstitutional without the ratification of the U.S. Constitution, 14th Amendment. We also know that this U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that several Articles of the Bill of Rights may be applied to the States of the Union only through the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. As the jurisdiction of this U.S. Supreme Court is in question, you may want to wait for the U.S. Archivist to issue forth his determination before moving forward on the case of Deborah Morse et.al., vs. Joseph Frederick.

In keeping the Justices of this U.S. Supreme Court advised of the proceedings that is now pending before the Archivist of the United States, enclosed is a true and correct copy of the letter and computer diskette that has been received by U.S. Archivist, Allen Weinstein, on December 13, 2006. Any determination that may issue forth declaring the U.S. Constitution, 14th Amendment to have been rejected after being printed in the text and law books for a number of years is not unprecedented. We find that the original 13th Amendment prohibiting any Public Official from accepting any “*Titles of Nobility*” was also printed in the text and law books of the several States of the Union and all Territories of the United States and yet it was removed in the year of 1860 upon the determination of U.S. Secretary of State, John.M. Clayton, that it was never ratified.


